Shirley Bennett-Anderson began a mission to "Keep the Secretariat Legacy Alive" in 2009 by breeding exclusively to Champion Stallions which carried Secretariat bloodlines. Secretariat's Fire. his last producing daughter in the world, foaled two grandsons for Shirley. The first, Secretariat's Glory, was a surprise birthday gift and was listed on the 2013 KY Derby contender list along with another descendant, My Storm Trooper. Both were side-lined with injuries. Her introduction to the world of racing was an eye-opener. Then her disappointment escalated when a devastating phone call on 12/10/2015 notified her that her 2nd Secretariat grandson, Johnny Leroy (named in honor of her late husband) was euthanized at a South Florida training track just weeks before his first race.

The tragedy reads like a Hollywood Script, but the story isn't finished. Shirley's original mission to grow the "Secretariat Family Tree" had just been chopped in half. After much sorrowful prayer, she withdrew from racing to pursue another direction...one which takes her back to her thirty year career of helping people. Shirley's new vision is to use her Secretariat family members to help heal Veterans and Special Needs Children at Glory Meadows.


